My Pet's Dry Eyes

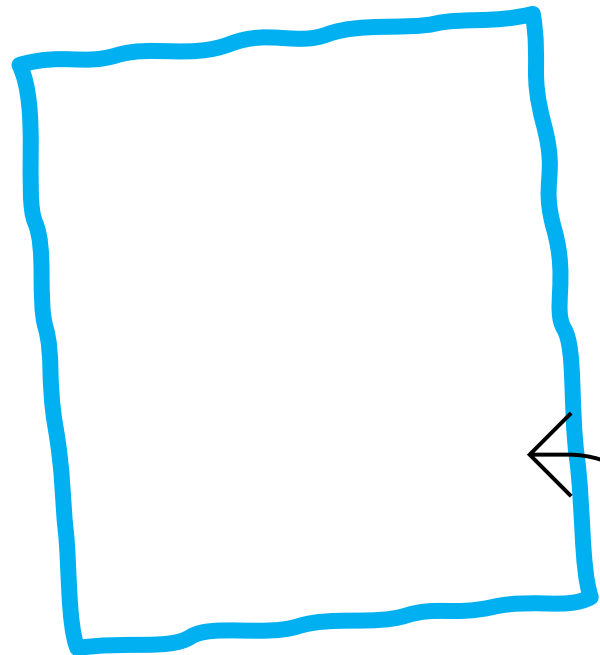
Hello, your vet has told us that your pet been into visit them.

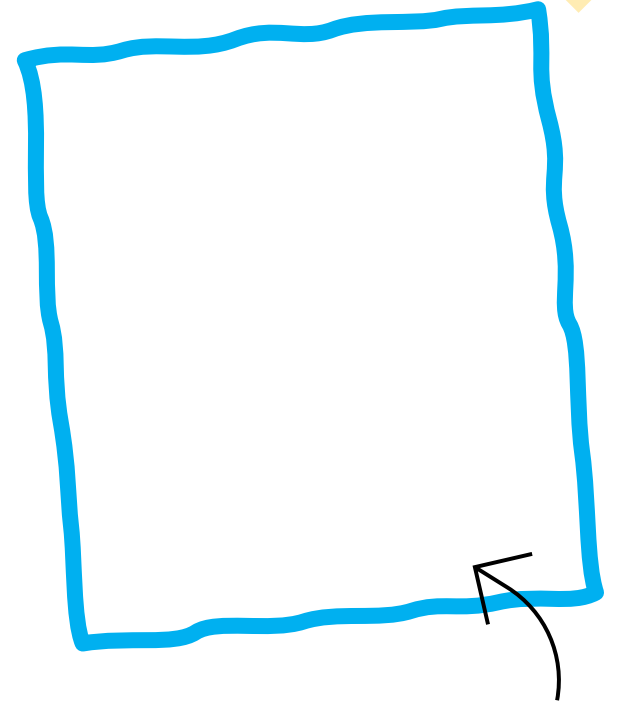
What is Dry Eye?

Most of us have eyes which we can use to see the world. Eyes are very delicate and can be hurt easily.

Pets have eyes too, just like us, and when a pet has "dry eye" their eyes don't make enough tears. If a pet doesn't make enough tears their eyes will become very sore and may even get ulcers (sore lumps on their eye).

Sore eyes are no fun, they can make your pet less likely to want to stroke them. It's not because they don't want to be your friend, it's just sometimes stroking too close to their face can make them uncomfortable.

It's really important to be kind and gentle with your pet, especially if they have sore eyes.

How Can You Help?



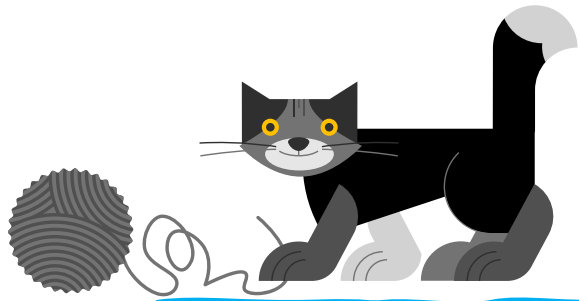
Here are some things that you and your adult can do to help your pet stay comfy

- ✓ Make sure you don't stroke around your pet's face - you may accidentally hurt them. If you make a mistake and forget, don't worry, your pet will still be your best friend.
- ✓ Sometimes your vet will give your pet a special collar to wear, it looks like a big cone and it is used to stop your pet rubbing their eyes if they are really sore. It is very important that you don't take the cone off your pet, even if they look like they want it off.
- ✓ Your vet will probably give your grown up eye drops to put in your pet's eyes. These drops are like pretend tears and will make sure your pet's eyes don't dry out. Why not keep a diary of whether your pet has had their eye medicine?
- ✓ You and your grown up can look at your pet's eyes from a distance. Don't touch their eyes or hold their face as this could upset them. Instead, wait until they are calm and see if their eyes look red or sore.



Remember to never climb on your pet or pull them around as this may hurt them.



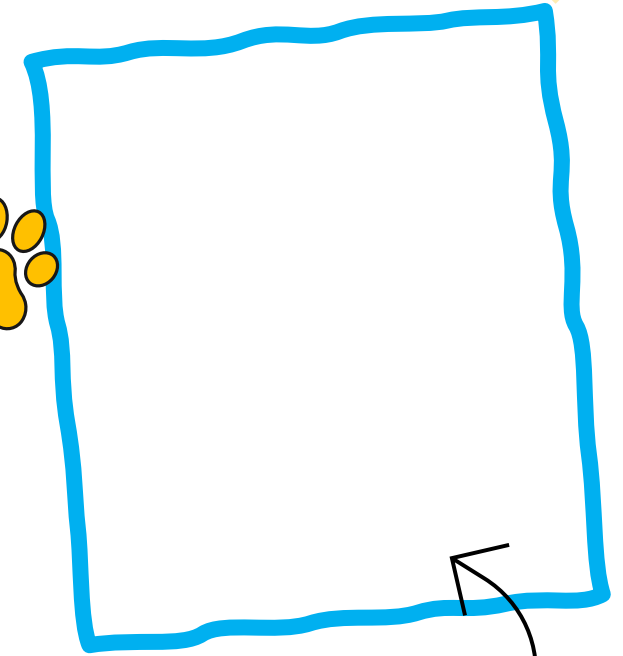


Being Safe with Medicine

Sometimes pets with dry eye will need to take medicine everyday to stop them having sore eyes. This medicine has been picked by a vet and is perfect for your pet!

Here are some rules about medicine:

- You must never touch your pet's medicine as it can be dangerous for children.
- Medicine should only be given to your pet by a grown up.
- The medicine for your pet should be kept in a cupboard or fridge out of the way.
- If you ever find your pet's medicine, you should tell an adult who can put it away in a safe place.
